What are your rights?





You have a right to have sexual life

You have a right to choose your partner for sex





You have a right to learn more about sex

You have a right to use sexual devices



How we support you in your sexual expression?



We will discuss with you about your feelings and sexual preferences



We will explain about your rights & options for your sexual expression



We will explain about consequences of your choices



We will respect your privacy & will not tell anyone about your sex life



How we support you in your sexual expression?



We will help you to understand if someone sexually abusing you



We will help you to make complaints if someone is sexually abusing you



We will help you to find materials to learn more about sex

We will help you to understand what is legal and what is not legal about sex



What you should know?



You and your partner should be 16 years or above to have sex



Any materials or videos involving child sex is not permitted by law



Doing sexual activity in public place is an offense



Doing sexual activity with a family member (except your spouse) is an offense



What you should know?



Anyone having sex with you without your permission is called rape & punishable by law



You can get paid sex services from authorised places



You can always say 'No' for having sex if you do not want to
